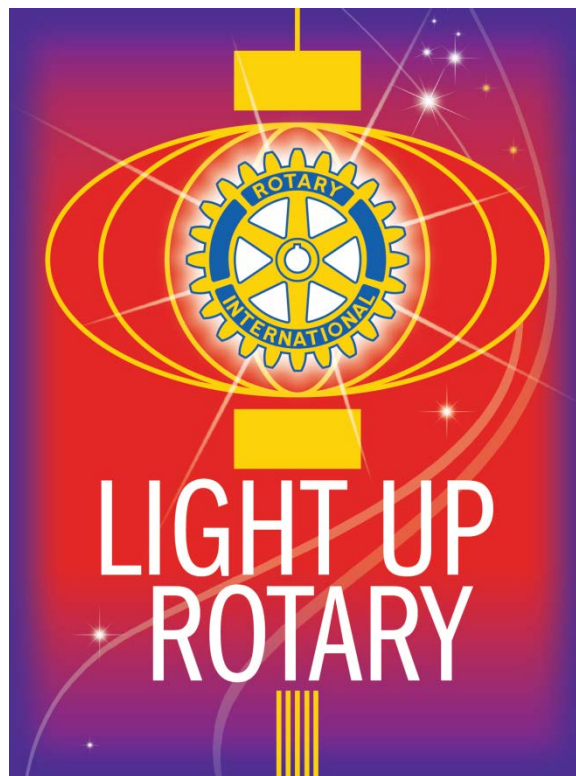

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2014-2015

Light Up Rotary

RI President, Gary Huang, challenged all Rotarians this year to "Light Up Rotary". Gary was inspired to choose this theme by the words of Confucius, who said, "It is better to light a single candle than to sit and curse the darkness". This year, more than 1.2 million Rotarians have lit their own candles in tens of thousands of communities.

The RC Bayside Geelong has certainly been lighting up Rotary. We have stepped up and fulfilled many of the challenges Gary set us. We worked at bringing in new members and approaching membership in new ways. We held a "Women in Rotary" membership drive, resulting in 2 new members. The club held a Rotary Day in conjunction with the Ken Wilks Spirit of the Heart Awards Day, where we informed the community of the great work that rotary and our club does, handing out printed material about rotary. The RC of Bayside Geelong might be a small club but it has certainly achieved a lot in the past 12 months and should be justifiably proud of its efforts.



Club Visioning

This year one of my goals was to lead the club through the Club Visioning Process. This began back in October with our facilitator Warren Norton leading us through the various exercises to direct us to develop a 3 year strategic plan. It was a great night with 100% of members in attendance. I am pleased to say that we are well on the way, having developed our vision statement, our mission statement and our club priorities. Each committee is now developing their action plans which will be collated and then discussed with all members before being put into a club action plan. The strategic plan will allow us to see how we are travelling so that the club will stay relevant to current and potential members.

Interclub Projects and Activities

Another of my goals this year was to become involved with projects overseas and with other clubs. In January the RCs of Bayside Geelong and Torquay came together for the annual club get together. We met at Brian Burch's house where we had a fun interclub cricket match and auction. We were fed with scrumptious pizzas from Frank Anuzzi's mobile pizza van and delicious desserts brought by both clubs. It was a great night of fun and raised \$500 for the Freshwater Creek Fire Brigade.



The club also became involved with other rotary clubs in the Geelong area to run the Ride the Bellarine. This was a successful project raising much needed money for Polio.

The club, worked with other clubs to finance special breastfeeding chairs for the newly refurbished special care nursery at the University Hospital in Geelong.

The club has thrown its support to working with other Geelong clubs in the fight against ICE in the local community.

Members of the club have given blood as part of the RED 25 project to support our district to raise the most blood donations.

The club continues to support the Christ Church Meals Program, along with a number of other Geelong Rotary Clubs, by volunteering and with financial support.

The club has enjoyed visiting other rotary club's meetings to hear various guest speakers and enjoy the company of other Rotarians.

Fundraising

We have again had a very busy year of fundraising activities including BBQs and catering events along with raising funds selling Entertainment Books and raffle tickets via the Ballarat South RC Car raffle. Fundraising Chair John Spiteri went to great efforts to secure one of the prize cars and a venue in central Geelong to enable us to sell tickets.

Catering for the City of Greater Geelong Worker's and Families Christmas Party was our major fundraising activity for the year. Thanks to the wonderful organisation skills of the fundraising committee along with the assistance of members, partners, and friends of rotary on the night, it was a resounding success.



The club has secured a new venue at the Vines Road Community Centre holding a monthly BBQ at their community Friday night market. Hopefully this will inject more funds into the fundraising account along with our other venues – Woolworths and Bunnings.

Community and Vocational Service

Daryll Webb Director of the Community and Vocational Committee and his hard working team organised another successful and inspiring Ken Wilks Spirit of the Heart Awards Day, again securing major sponsorship from the TAC. This year we were fortunate in having a representative from TAC attending to see where their sponsorship is going

Daryll also involved the club in supporting a needy family in the Geelong Community via the Geelong Advertiser's Christmas Family Appeal. Members generously donated gifts and food stuffs.

The club supported six Geelong secondary schools by providing literacy prizes to worthy students. Members of the club have been educating us about their various vocations with workplace visits and virtual tours via power point presentations.



Foundation

The Foundation Committee lead by Director, David Fisher, inspired at least 80% members to support the Centurion program this year. Maybe next year we can to 100%.

The club has supported many overseas crises supplying funds to support various projects such as Shelterbox, Aqua box, Donations-in-Kind, Interplast and Polio Plus.

PP Telsa Stubna inspired the club into supporting the “Days for Girls” Project, which has been very hands on with over 200 hours of working bees involved with the making and assembly of the hygiene kits. Over 100 kits have been made and sent off to various countries, so far. I would like to offer a big thankyou to Telsa for all of her hard work in coordinating this most worthwhile project.

The club has also developed a close connection with a small overseas school where we been involved with supplying library books, educational materials and sports equipment to the Salamanca Elementary School in the Philippines. The students and teachers have been so grateful to receive these much needed supplies and they now proudly have a library of books to read and enjoy.

Youth

The Youth Services Committee lead by Phil Quick has involved the club in supporting a number of young people in the RYLA, RYPEN and NYSF programs. The club sent out an outbound exchange student to Germany and is getting ready to welcome an inbound exchange student from France in early July. It is always great to see our New Gen Friends visiting from time to time and catch up on what they are up to.



Membership, PR & Fun

Director Jo White and her ‘Fun’ Team have been busy organising various membership drives and fun social activities for all members to enjoy and socialise. Members have enjoyed such things as a bonfire night, Mexican Night, a Hawaiian **lueio**, a walking progressive dinner, to name but a few. The team is working at present on sending in an application to District to secure funds to purchase pull up banners, flags etc. to better promote our club. Peter Kavenagh keeps the club website up to date and Simon Empson works on the Facebook page to let everyone know what we are up to. Thanks and well done.

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2014-2015

The Committee is pleased to report another excellent fundraising effort for the 2014-15 year. BBQs and event catering continue to be the main types of fundraising activity operated by the Club supplemented by product sales such as raffles, progressive dinner, fellowship nights and personal member contributions, e.g. Centurion, fines, etc.

Unfortunately, the number of fundraising venues for 2014-15 has been reduced somewhat over previous years due to financial constraints and other circumstances. Bunnings Torquay (due to severe storm damage at the store in 2014), Bunnings North Geelong, the Careers Expo and Blokes Day Out are some of the venues we have not serviced this year.

Our major source of income from BBQ and catering events this year has been from venues at Woolworths Torquay, Bunnings Waurin Ponds (first time for a long while) and the City of Greater Geelong staff Christmas Party. Other BBQ venues, which have contributed to funds raised, include Mitre 10 at Wallington, Ariston House Child Minding Family BBQ,

the Vines Rd Friday Night Markets and a one-off event at National Tiles in Marshal.

Funds raised from BBQs conducted throughout the year amount to nearly \$16,000 after expenses. A more concerted effort was made this year in selling The Rotary Club of Ballarat car raffle tickets which netted a profit of just over \$1,200. For a Club membership of 19 members, this is a great result and members should be proud of this achievement. The BBQs and other food preparation/serving events had the added benefit of providing members with opportunities to enjoy fellowship with each other and the public while serving the community.

A successful fundraising year has once again enabled our Club to donate and sponsor many and various projects and programs including the Christ Church Community Meals Program, the Ken Wilks Spirit of the Heart Award, Youth Exchange, TRF Polio Eradication, NYSF, Interplast, Literacy programs at various state schools & in the Philippines, Shelterbox Australia, Aquabox, Donations in Kind, Geelong Prostate Support Group and many others.





Highlights for the Year:

- Our most significant fundraisers were again the COGG Christmas catering and Bunnings Waurn Ponds BBQ netting approx. \$7,500 and just over \$2,000 respectively.
- With our membership numbers down to 19, the Club has had to curtail the number of BBQ events and to this end, has

set a target of conducting one, and maybe two, BBQs a month depending on our ability to man the events.

- Thanks to the generosity of Robin and Andrea in providing a home for the club BBQ trailer and storage of all associated equipment.
- Some expenditure has been necessary on the BBQ trailer to upgrade the springs, tyres and install an override brake system in order to comply with RTA trailer weight regulations. The trailer now has a towing capacity of 1,400kg.

Acknowledgements:

As always, the Club is indebted to John Virgona, Robin Hunt and Brian Burch for their unceasing efforts in housing, maintaining and provisioning of the BBQ trailer, maintaining inventories of consumables, organising individual events, assisting with rosters and providing guidance to club members on how to operate BBQs.

On behalf of the membership, I would like to formally acknowledge John, Brian, Robin and Peter Hynes for their valued input as Fundraising Committee members whose dedication to Rotary service has been amazing and inspiring and without whose help it would not have been possible to achieve such a successful fundraising year. To Brian, John and Robin, I would like to extend personal and heartfelt thanks for their unwavering support during the year.



The Fundraising Committee would like to thank those members who organised specific fundraising events and all members and friends of RCBG who gave up their valuable time to help operate BBQs and to prepare and serve food at all the events held during the Rotary year.

During the Rotary year 2014 – 2015 the Community Services and Vocational Services committee have initiated and achieved the following:

Literacy

A literacy prize in the form of Book Vouchers of \$50 was presented to six schools – Geelong High School, Newcomb Secondary College, Belmont High School, Grovedale Secondary College, Oberon High School, and Western Heights Secondary College. The prize is presented by the school to the student or students who have displayed excellence in literacy or would benefit from this gift to improve literacy skills. The student, who received the voucher from Oberon High School, sent a letter of thanks to the Rotary Club.



Community Projects

Our Club members assist with the Christ Church Community Meals Program on a quarterly basis on Monday evenings at the Christ Church centre. This assistance has been in the form of hands on as members volunteer their time on a roster to assist in the serving of the meals and cleaning of the kitchen.

The Club members took on the task of providing foods and Christmas gifts for a family of a dad with four children as part of the “Adopt a Family” program for 2014. We were able to put together qty 4 boxes of food and gifts for a family with six children and the club members had a huge thrill out of assisting the family in this way.



Ken Wilks Spirit of the Heart Award

The majority of the time and effort in the third quarter was taken up with the Ken Wilks Spirit of the Heart Award. This year the award ceremony was held in October at Buckley’s Function Centre. Once again we are grateful to Encompass for the use of their premises for the interviews. Applications were received from Encompass and Diversitat. We are also grateful to the generous financial support from the T.A.C and it was great that Hamish Heard was able to attend representing the T.A.C and present the award. This year we interviewed a total of five wonderful people who were worthy of receiving the award. We had the pleasure of Dr John Oswald from Interplast to be our guest speaker and he was able to bring with him two doctors from Indonesia.

This was a significant occasion because we had three of the past winners present at the award ceremony; Greg Puls (2009), Simone Stevens (2011) and last year's winner Michael Chan (2013).

I would like to thank the Vocational Team for their assistance and in particular President Judy as MC and Marilyn Fisher and Jo White for their assistance in interviewing and presenting the awards.

Vocational Visit

Phil Quick presented a visual vocational visit because it was not possible for him to take us for a workplace visit. It was of the new Melbourne Cancer Hospital which it to replace the Peter McCallum Hospital and provide physical links to the Royal Melbourne Hospital. He showed us a video of the hospital being constructed and also a graphic 3 dimensional view of how the hospital will function once completed. The committee are looking at other workplace visits to be held later in 2015.

Through Foundation grants, Rotarians are able to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, support of education and working towards the alleviation of poverty.

Sarah Edwards the coordinator of the Salamanca school project we have been supporting visited the Club to provide us with an update from the school.

The 400 books we sent arrived on 31/12/14 and as a result the school now have a proper library established with groups of 10-12 students using the library. Australian reading books are so different with far more brightly coloured illustrations than those few supplied locally. The

students are thrilled to receive books from Australia and love to learn from them. This has been greeted with such enthusiasm by teachers as well.

A folder of thank you cards with messages of thanks written by the children was presented to our club by Sarah.

Our next project is to provide a pair of shoes for



every one of the 655 children attending the school.

We will also continue our ongoing support by providing books for the library.

Hearts to Harmony Foundation

Lauren and Cassie Gravett (two Geelong girls) established the Hearts to Harmony Foundation, a Non-Government Organization (NGO) based in Siem Reap Cambodia.



Lauren and Cassie aborted their holiday and hope of work in the UK, to follow a calling at Siem Reap Village, 60 Kilometres from Phnom Penh, where their search for a coffee hit led them to starting a cafe, sourcing local coffee beans and providing work. Their profits help to educate local girls.

Their aim is to enhance the lives of individuals in pursuit of studying and creating a healthy and safe environment for them. They provide education scholarships from primary schooling through to university studies. Their outreach program consists of regular health workshops, assistance with dental care, and monthly food packages to all their families in rural Siem Reap.

Programs Include: Bicycle program of 1 bike per family Food and Rice Program. After 6 months only rice is supplied. By then the family is supplying their own vegetables. The philosophy is to give them a hand up not a handout, to set them up as a micro business so they can support themselves as there are no pensions in Cambodia.

They support “Days for Girls” Project in Cambodia and “TNAI SAMRAP SREY”, Green Geckos Street

Kids Project.

It is amazing what these two young ladies have achieved.

Bayside Rotary has provided the following support to **Hearts to Harmony Foundation:**

We have given a donation of 20 “Days for Girls” kits and the Club’s old computer with carry case which will be used for Word processing tasks.

Days For Girls

This project helps girls gain access to quality sustainable feminine hygiene and awareness, by direct distribution of sustainable feminine hygiene kits, by partnering with non-profits, groups and organizations, by raising awareness, and by helping communities around the world start their own programs. Thanks to a global grassroots network of thousands of volunteers and supporters on 6 continents, we have reached women and girls in 75+ countries on 6 continents.



This project at a Club level has been very capably managed by Telsa Stubna who coordinated the project on behalf of the Club. Sourcing of materials and coordination of working bees has led to successful completion of around 100 kits being supplied from our Geelong Bayside team.

Ride the Bellarine

The Club also supported the District "Ride the Bellarine" fundraiser which raised approx. \$45,000 for Polio Plus.

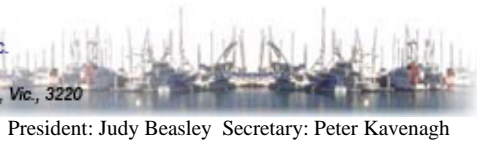
