process, and presented them chocolates to all enjoy with the morning tea.

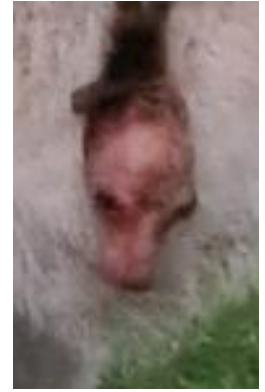

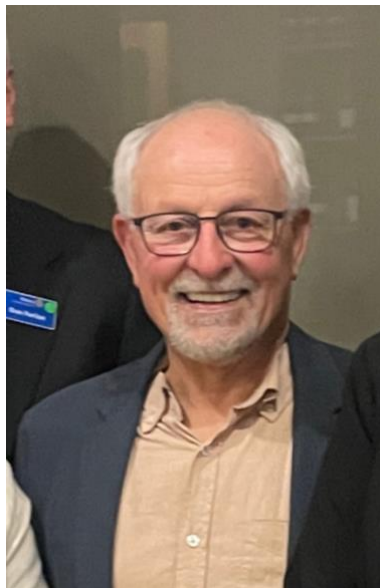
OUT AND ABOUT
