As you will see below in all the reports we support so many things in the community and also abroad.

A special thank you to those who supported us for the big events as that particularly is a big stressful and demanding occasion. All of you and you know who you are another thank you.

Firstly at this point I would like to just give a big thank you to John Virgona who began this year as the Fundraising Director. Unfortunately around Nov. he developed some pain, mostly back, but in reality the source is unknown. He has been unwell since and been unable to continue with the fundraising. The Community and Vocational Services Committee has worked hard to **"Be the Inspiration"** during the rotary year with many great outcomes.

Community Service Projects

Barwon Health Volunteer Patient Transport Program

Bayside Geelong Rotary, along with a number of other rotary clubs in the Geelong area, has continued to financially support the Barwon Health Volunteer Patient Transport Program. This wonderful program transports thousands of people in need each year to their medical appointments and treatments. Four vehicles operate 364 days per year, ferrying 1600 patients per year and average 54,000 km per year each. Our wonderful members, Jo White and Judy Eyles, generously give their time as volunteer drivers with the program. Well done ladies!!!

This year the club contributed \$3,000 towards the upkeep of the four patient transport vehicles.

The Club also held a Trivia Night in May, which attracted around 100 people to the event. It was a very successful night raising around \$2,000 for the Barwon Health Volunteer Transport Program.

Geelong Christ Church Community Meals Program

Bayside Geelong Rotary continues to support the Geelong Christ Church Community Meals Program.

Members volunteer their services on a quarterly roster on the first Monday of the month, which is coordinated by, now Friend of Rotary, PP John Spiteri. Our members assist with setting up the dining room, meal preparation and serving of the meals as well as cleaning up afterwards. Over 100 meals can be served on the night to those in need in our Geelong community. The club has continued its financial support of the program with a pledge of \$1,500.

Literacy in Schools

Bayside Geelong Rotary has continued its support for six Geelong Secondary Schools by providing a **Literacy Award** in the form of a \$50.00 book voucher from Dymocks Bookstore. The schools involved are Belmont High School, Geelong High School, Grovedale Secondary College, Newcomb Secondary College, Oberon High School and Western Heights Secondary College. The Award is presented to a student who has displayed excellence in literacy or would benefit from this award to improve their literacy skills. From the letters of thanks received from the schools involved, they are very appreciative of the club's continued support.



Preserve Planet Earth Tree Planting Challenge

Last year we were challenged by the then Rotary International President, Ian Riseley, for every Rotarian around the world to plant a tree which will total 1.2 million trees, to celebrate Earth Day and assist in solving environmental issues. Bayside Geelong Rotary along with a couple of other rotary clubs worked with Highton RC, and the City of Greater Geelong, to plant 1500 trees along the Waurin Ponds Creek area in August 2018. It was quite a cool day but very rewarding.



Find Mind – Motor Neurone Disease - District Governor's Wife Kerrie's Project

This year the District Governor, Anthony Ohlson's wife Kerrie, asked every club in District 9780 to support the Motor Neurone Disease Project. Bayside Geelong Rotary happily donated \$1,000 towards this project.

Australia's Biggest Morning Tea to Support the Cancer Research

A Morning Tea was held in May by PP Judy Beasley, to raise much needed funds to be the Inspiration in the fight against cancer. 1 in 2 Australians are impacted by cancer by the age of 85.

Fourteen lovely ladies and gentlemen attended and enjoyed a delicious morning tea. They were very generous in their support, playing games and activities along with a monster mystery raffle. \$400.00 was raised from the morning tea and thanks must go to all who donated food and raffle prizes. A wonderful effort by all.

On "Hat" Day last October, members were asked to wear a hat and give a gold coin donation while enjoying Chinese at a restaurant in Leopold. It was a fun night and the club increased the donation to \$100 to Rotary Health Australia.

Support for the New Anam Cara Facility

Bayside Geelong Rotary joined with many other rotary clubs across Geelong, attending the Geelong Rotary Anam Cara Fundraising Dinner held on May 16th at Truffleduck’s in Fyansford. Bayside donated \$1750.00 to purchase a table, of which 10 members and partners paid back \$50.00 for their seat. All money raised from the purchase of a table was donated to the cause. All food, wine and wait staff was donated. \$171,000 was raised from auction items, donations and pledges which was then matched by a local Geelong identity and the sum total resulted in a huge \$342,000.

A wonderful effort by all concerned. The money raised will go towards the construction of a new facility at the Waurn Ponds University complex.

The RC Bayside Geelong has also financially supported a number of local groups in the Geelong Community including Peace of Mind Foundation (\$1,000), Drought Relief (\$1,000) and those Left Behind (Police Mental Health) \$1,000.

ROTARY FOUNDATION/INTERNATIONAL REPORT

The Rotary Foundation is the charitable arm of Rotary International and is supported by contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation.

Through Foundation Grants Rotarians are able to advance world understanding, goodwill and peace through the improvement of health, support of education and working towards the alleviation of poverty.

Aims this year:

- To encourage a club member to undertake District Training for Grant applications
- To encourage members participation in the Centurion program
- To participate in International programs such as water/sanitation, DIK, ROMAC, RAM, ShelterBox
- To continue the Days for Girls (D4G) program

District Training:

This year we thank Treasurer David for completing District Training for Grants, and PP Peter Kavenagh and Secretary Telsa Stubna gained accreditation while attending District Assembly.

The club plans to apply for a District Grant in the next financial year to support the purchase of another car for Barwon Health's Volunteer Patient Transport Program.

Centurion:

Members have been encouraged regularly and have received updates from Treasurer David as to each member's progress with the \$100 Centurion Program. Most members have contributed throughout the year, thus helping increase funds for The Rotary Foundation.

International programs:

Donations in Kind (DIK) requested financial assistance for the cost of sending containers overseas and we donated \$1000. This Rotary arm supplies donated goods to International communities in need of furniture, books, clothing, household items and medical equipment.



We again contributed \$1000 to ShelterBox which supplies essential items including tents, bedding, cooking and heating, water purifying kits and tools, to those communities affected by cyclones, floods, fires, earthquakes and other emergency situations. Rotary District is planning to present all 3-year donors to the ShelterBox program with online banner awards in one of three levels: gold, silver or bronze, to add to their webpages.

Our club also supported Interplast \$1000, ROMAC \$500, Foundation \$1000 and Polio Plus \$1000.

Days for Girls:

This project helps girls gain access to sustainable feminine hygiene and awareness, through direct distribution of washable kits, by partnering with NFP groups and organizations, by raising awareness and by helping communities around the world start their own programs. This in turn means that girls can attend school more often, their work prospects improve and they can live with dignity and pride. Our small group has now sewn a total in excess of 800 kits

since its inception, costing \$10 and taking 3 hours to produce and pack each kit. Special thanks to the support given by Rotarians partners and friends who meet on a monthly basis. The Days for Girls network has now reached 110 countries, supplied well over 1 million kits from 1000 teams worldwide and set up 15 enterprise countries. Bayside supports the project with \$1500 annually. Thanks go to past member Ken Wilks



who continued his past generosity by donating another 4-thread overlocking machine to our group.

For friends travelling overseas who pack kits into their luggage we have given:

- Jan from Bali Smiles, 30 kits
- Dr. Emma for Zambia: 80 kits
- Tania for Indonesia: 30 kits
- Hairdressers: 30 kits
- Telsa for Africa: 30 kits

The Geelong Rotary International Clubs group has been meeting regularly this year with the intention of supporting International projects and applying for multiple grants as a group. Bayside members decided as a club to support appeals closer to home, such as those in the Asia Pacific Region. No final decisions have been made by GRIC at this point in time.

Thank you to Bayside Geelong Rotary Club members for your continued support and for donating to this Committee through supporting fundraisers, raffles, Centurion and special appeals.

Interim Financial Report 2018-2019
