Well done DG Lesley and the Torquay Rotary Club plus our own Judy B.

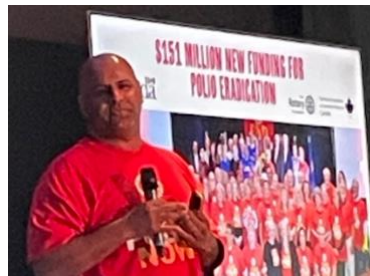
End Polio, Domestic Violence, Mental Health were all on the program as well as many more highlights.
