But as one problem is solved, (restricted numbers) another one could become a problem, fire restrictions. Brian has already spoken to the Freshwater Creek fire brigade, and for safety reasons they will be joining us with their new fire truck, to make sure we and Brian's property stay safe.

The good news is our Trivia night on Friday November 19th has been given an all clear to go ahead. The Geelong West Town Hall have given us conformation with the following details that will apply.

Groups Checking Double Vaccinated Status

- *Community halls and hubs can open if everyone present is fully vaccinated (indoors at one person per 4 sqm)*
- *All groups need to have a Covid Check in Marshal to ensure people are checked in to the QR Codes and have a Double Vaccinated Certificate.*
No single vaccinations allowed. Exemptions are children 16 years and under and people with Medical Exemptions.
- *You must wear a face mask while indoors unless you have a lawful exception.*
- *Distancing of 1.5m apart still apply*
- *No Dance Floor*

The Main Hall with the 1:4sqm ratio can have 165 people.

As it states masks will apply but can be remove when eating and drinking. So, if you haven't purchased your ticket because you were wanting to get the go ahead. Now's the time to jump online and organise your table of eight.

They were also goods that would otherwise have ended up in land fill. All goods were prepared and packed by the 30 or so Rotarians and Volunteers who regularly participate at the depot.
