Donations In Kind at Work – Supporting Schools and Gender Based Violence Victims in PNG

District 9780 DIK has recently sent a container of repurposed and recycled donated goods to the Port Moresby area in the Gulf Province of Papua New Guinea.

Working with Lucy Loco, a DIK committee member who is from the area, all goods loaded were very targeted to be very useful to the recipients at primary schools and gender-based violence victims. They were also goods that would otherwise have ended up in land fill. All goods were prepared and packed by the 30 or so Rotarians and Volunteers who regularly participate at the depot.

The photos speak for themselves. Everything was useful and well received. Along with all the smiles the children at the schools enthusiastically assisted in installing their new desks and equipment in their new school building. Have a look!
