Rotary, providing us with the opportunity to me a difference

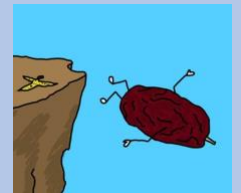
Hello all,

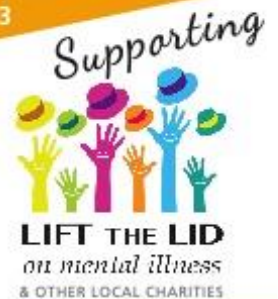
